RIGHTS & RESPONSIBILITIES

As a participant in the Dardi Munwurro program you have the right to:

- Respect
- A culturally appropriate service
- A safe and high quality service
- Good communication
- Assistance if you are unhappy with our service, and to have a support person assist you
- Be involved in decision making and ask questions about how we support you
- Make a complaint

As a participant, you have the responsibility to:

- Provide us with correct and up-to-date information
- Show respect for our staff, mentors, other community members and Dardi Munwurro property
- Tell us if you will not be attending an appointment, group or camp
- Not behave in a violent, aggressive or threatening manner when attending a group camp or other activity
- Not be intoxicated or under the influence of drugs while attending our programs

WE WORK WITH ACSO CLIENTS

(Australian Community Support Organisation)

We work with ACSO clients (mandated) under the framework of our Koori Community A&D (KADW) program.

This program is designed and managed by First Nations AOD workers. The program's principles take into account fundamental issues such as intergenerational trauma and racism.

Men and women and young people are eligible to take part in this program.

WHAT MAKES US DIFFERENT?

- At Dardi Munwurro, self-determination, culture and identity are important and determine our work practices and how we communicate with the community.
- We value the wisdom of our Elders and involve them in our work. Our clients have access to our Elders.
- We employ First Nations AOD workers who have both the lived experience and learned knowledge and skills to be able to work effectively with our clients.
- We are a holistic service which enables us to refer our clients to other in house programs such as:

The Bramung Jaarn Youth Program

The Men's Healing & Behaviour Change program

WE WORK WITH COMMUNITY CLIENTS

We work directly with the community through community service organisations, families and individuals seeking help.

Basically we will work with all First Nations people seeking support for an AOD issue.

We will conduct assessments, provide care & recovery coordination, counselling services, brief intervention and referral pathways.
